Dear Friends of MCC,

Martin Luther's Evening Prayer: I thank you, my heavenly Father. through Jesus Christ, your dear Son, that you have graciously kept me this day. Forgive me all my sins, and graciously keep me this night. Into your hands I commend myself, my body, and soul, and all things. Let your holy angel be with me, that the wicked foe may have no power over me.

Our lives as Christians are faced with many pitfalls. As Christians, we face unique temptations this unbelieving world does not. As Christians we long for a new heaven and a new earth, while we watch the present heaven and earth pass away. We struggle at times with our own physical bodies all the while looking forward to the new body we will receive in the resurrection.

That can be a lot to worry about, can't it? And then throw on top of all this a sixteen-month pandemic and we may find ourselves worried about many things. These are stressful times indeed. As Christians, though, we don't have to react to this world in a way that produces more stress upon ourselves. You have someone who cares and is interceding for you – Christ Jesus our Lord. As we have just celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, let's not forget that God has not left us to our own devices to solve our problems. God sent Jesus our Lord as our personal Savior, and the Holy Spirit to dwell within us.
