We are living in the absence category of life right now. But just think we have gotten by since mid-March living under pandemic restrictions – just maybe we can make it through this. And just maybe we will be a bit "fonder" or appreciate more our time together as part of our dear McCutchanville Community Church.

Just Remember:

Church Conference on Sunday, September 6th @ 11:30 AM

At the August 11, 2020 McCutchanville Ad Council Meeting the council voted to sell our main parsonage. We have rented it since our last full-time pastor in 2012, and it was recently vacated. Currently we are making some much needed improvements to the home, which is located at 8631 Clifton Drive about 2-3 miles from the church. The parsonage is

paid for and a realtor gave an estimated value of \$190,000 after we are done with the improvements, such as a new heating/cooling system, flooring, kitchen counter-top, and painting. Much of the work has now been completed and was done by volunteers. We have budgeted \$15,000-25,000 for the improvements. Funding for this project is coming from the proceeds of our food trailer.

We have our original parsonage located across Kansas Road from the church that we are presently renovating. It had also been rented until we decided to do a full remodel beginning in early 2019. With the complete remodeling, this 3 bedroom, 2.5 bathroom home with detached 2 car garage will once again meet the standards for a parsonage. There remains an estimated \$50,000+ in cost to finish this work.

The intention of the Administrative Council is to take the proceeds from the sale of the Clifton Drive parsonage and apply to our church mortgage, which today has \$197,000 remaining, thus practically wiping out the balance owed, getting us out of debt. (We pay \$4000/month on our mortgage payment)

UMC Conference Assistant Superintendent Randy Anderson will conduct the Church Conference following worship on Sunday, September 6th. This is the formal vote to approve/disapprove the sale. Only members of MCC are allowed to vote, which will be done by paper ballot. And there are no absentee ballots, you must be present. The conference room will be provided for those who are unable to wear a mask for any length of time.



Worship & COVID-19

We are coming back to in-person worship on Sunday, September 6th. We will follow required government guidelines of wearing masks and social distancing. However, we will provide the conference room as a place for those who are unable to wear a mask for any length of time. The room is equipped with sound and video. We do ask that masks be worn

upon entering, in hallways, and exiting the building. Social distancing should also be followed in the conference room as in the sanctuary. Masks and hand sanitizer are readily available upon entering the church.



Showing Kindness

We plan to continue the Tuesday evening meals. They have been so well received. Each week 70-80 meals are being sent out of the kitchen to your homes. If you haven't tried this meal, you are urged to give it a try. You might be wondering how this is being covered financially –

the answer is easy - it is being covered through faithful donations by many. Some of the donations have come from outside the church by persons who have heard about and seen this kindness and ministry in action.

The second act of kindness is in feeding the youth at the UMC Youth Home. The Friendship Sunday School Class has fed these teenagers on three different occasions and plan to do this again in the near future. The reception that we receive is truly genuine and appreciative – typically pizza is brought in for the kids; however, we have taken meals and they love it!

Church Leadership

During the fall we are required to put together our Leadership Committee assignments for the next year before our annual charge conference which has been set for November 8th. During 2020 because of the virus, we have held very few meetings. Therefore, I would like to ask all persons to carry over their positions into 2021. If you are unable to do this, please let me know.

We started back to school on August 5th with a full house! 97 students are enrolled this year. An additional 2 year old class has been added.

Things are a bit different with the threat of Covid. The staff and teachers are doing an exceptional job of teaching, loving, playing, instructing, and somedays, just getting through it, as you can well imagine. Here is what we are doing:

Teachers and staff continue to wear masks.

Children are being dropped at the door by the parents. Someone meets the child at the door.

Children wash their hands as they arrive for the first of many times during the day.

Children stay together in their classroom group and do not intermingle with other groups very often.

Chapel time with Pastor Greg and Teresa will resume on September 2nd. We have missed Chapel time and this is just one way we are returning to normalcy.

Children are once again eating in the lunchroom rather than their classrooms.

There is often just one group of children in the hallway.

Continue to pray for the students, staff and teachers. Thank you.

Due to Covid-19, all graduations were cancelled. We have scheduled a drive through graduation for our children who have left Pre-School and have gone one to Kindergarten



Graduation Drive Through will be September 3rd. Children will receive a Graduation Certificate and a Bible from the church. All of the material that they left when school closed in March will also be given to them. We miss the students but wish them the best as they go on to Kindergarden.



Due to Covid-19, we will not be taking field trips for a while. Fun days are being planned inside the classrooms, however. Our primary concern is that the children feel safe and are learning and playing together.

The Salvation Army has been busy assisting families in need because of the COVID-19 Pandemic. This has impacted all our lives in many unexpected ways. For many their job has been eliminated through company's shut down. For others there has been hours cut back. We have received \$150,000 in Emergency Response COVID-19 funds. To date we have assisted with \$217,402.04 as of August 10, 2020 to 541 families. We have received a matching grant from Lilly Foundation. We have now almost exhausted those matching monies. We have applied for additional funds but have not had a response to date.

My reason for writing is that fund raising has become more and more difficult for critical support programs. It appears that we may not be able to ring Christmas bells at some locations due to the store's policy on Covid-19 Social Distancing. We have received approval from Rural King and Hobby Lobby so far. Our bell-ringing activities in the past has been the support mechanism for these two programs.

Would you consider a monetary gift to help with our Food Pantry and Soup Kitchen programs? Maybe you would like to sponsor a day in the soup kitchen? (For instance, A single hot meal has an average cost of \$1.41 and an average day we would expect 300 participants - a sponsored day would be \$423.00) We need of your help.
